- Employees should self-isolate and call <u>Health Link 811</u> for additional precautions and follow-up testing if they have travelled to anywhere outside of Canada and experienced any of the following:
 - contact with someone who was suspected or confirmed to have the novel coronavirus
 - o were in a health-care facility
 - o have symptoms, such as cough or fever

If an employee does not meet the exposure criteria above, they do not need to stay away from work, and do not need any testing or a physician's note to attend work.
