**Please practice Fire Smart** and remember that emergency response call outs will have the Fire Department send the invoice to the Summer Village for payment, and from there it goes directly to you or your tax roll for payment. The average cost of fire suppression by the fire department is \$2,000.00 to \$15,000.00. Take care of and **REVIEW** your home insurance policy as some insurance companies do not insure for fire equipment in the case of a fire.

Some **additional things** you might consider doing in the fire protection of your home and property;

- ✓ Install on a wall at an easy assessable location an <u>ABC 3-5lb. Fire Extinguisher</u> as most home fires are started in the kitchen where things can get out of control very quickly.
- ✓ Keep all dead wood and debris in the yard and surrounding areas of the home cleared and stored **well away** from the house.
- ✓ Put a 4ft wide gravel circle around your fire pit and cover you fire with a spark COVER NO OPEN or UNATTENDED FIRES.
- ✓ Make sure your property has a <u>very clear and easy to see house number</u>.
- ✓ If your home has aluminum electrical wire, **have it inspected** by a Licensed Electrician.
- ✓ PUT OUT YOUR FIRE in the FIRE PIT when you are done WATER, STIR, WATER!!

### **ALL RESIDENTS – Attention please**

- Do NOT discharge a weapon or cross bow anywhere on municipal lands please report such activity - it's illegal as per the law;
- Do not make open fires anywhere; back yard fires must have a spark grill over fire and must be water, stir, water, stir when put out;
- ATV's must have spark arresters 15kph speed limit everywhere; West Cove Fire Trails ARE off limits:
- Day Park no alcohol, no cannabis, no music, no fires, don't litter;
- Dogs on a leash at all times everywhere and clean up after your dogs - STRAY dogs are reported to the Bylaw Officer at 780.967.2873;
- Respect your neighbour's amenity and foster peace and respect quiet times;
- Do not leave garbage bags on the road for the whole week;
- DOUSE the backyard fire/fire pits ONLY!!
- Out Streetlights can be reported to FORTIS directly – check out streetlights on the website and report a bulb or light requirement;

<u>September 30, 2021</u>

For those who can pay by June 30 kindly CONSIDER doing so.

To avoid a 2% monthly penalty please pay your property taxes by Sept 30<sup>th</sup>. Unpaid taxes will be subject to a 2% monthly penalty until December 1<sup>st</sup>. An 3% penalty will be added to all tax rolls that have a **total** outstanding balance owing January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2022.

The Sept 30<sup>th</sup> payment Deadline applies for all **non TPP** payments of current taxes.

### Tax Payment Plan (TPP)

Please be advised that the Village has changed over to direct debit **for all monthly** tax payments as of 2019. If you want to sign on for TPP you are required to submit a **signed and dated direct debit authorization form** from your bank – signed and dated PRIOR to January 15 of the new year - that is if you have not enrolled already.

Public Health and Novel Coronavirus Awareness

As a reminder, to help protect you and your family against all respiratory illnesses, including flu and COVID-19, you should:

## **Transmission Line Phase A - UPDATE**

The Summer Village of Sandy Beach and Sunrise Beach has opted out of the Transmission Line Phase A due to cost concerns about joining as well as ongoing operational costs. Currently The Joint Lagoon Committee is working on 4 options available for continuing use of the existing lagoon which has now complete the approved discharge in Sept 2021. The Joint Lagoon Committee is meeting at regular intervals to discuss grant options for determining the future use of the lagoon as well as regular business items that may arise. Speed Issues



We have received numerous calls in the administration office that there is a real problem with speeding and lack of safe driving in the residential areas. This poses a danger for anyone walking on the roadways and anyone riding bicycles. Signs are posted MAXIMUM 35 km/hr. Please slow down and obey the speed limits to avoid a tragic accident.

### ATV's

Reminder of the Off-Highway **Bylaw 06-2009** 



Operating hours on municipal roads are between 8:00am and 8:00pm.

Maximum speed is 15 km/hr unless otherwise posted.

ATVs are not permitted on the boulevards or ditches; they must be driven on the extreme right-hand side of road and shall travel single file at all times.

The Summer Village has a Bylaw in place whereby the Summer Village will remove 30lb. bags (5 household waste and 5 organics) every Monday excluding stat. holiday Mondays, when garbage will be picked up on the Tuesday.

Household Waste & Garbage must be stored in **weatherproof, watertight, animal proof BLACK** plastic bags and organics in CLEAR bags not exceeding 30lb. per bag. Scavenged bags will not be removed - no diapers, rotten meat etc. And please recycle as it makes cents and deposit your drink containers.

# PLEASE HAVE GARBAGE OUT BY 7:00 AM DAY OF PICK-UP and DO NOT LEAVE IT ON THE ROAD FOR DAYS

## Annual Spring and Fall clean-up - Check website for exact dates

This service is not intended for renovations or demolition or dangerous goods. It will be at the discretion of the Public Works staff what will be hauled away.

There is a fee for picking up appliances, mattresses & furniture with springs & metal.
